I would like to also take a moment and congratulate the chapters from NY who received National FFA Living to Serve Grants this year. Afton, Carthage, DeRuyter, Prattsburgh, Southern Cayuga, Greenwich and Hamilton all received these grants. Thus far, National FFA has awarded over \$440,000 to chapters in 42 states and Puerto Rico. Of this amount, NY Chapters received a total of \$15,270 that was used to support members of their communities that are in need. 

212/360: Registration for 212/360 is open. All conference information is available on our website. Please visit www.nysffa.org/212360. Please make sure to register in a timely fashion because there is a limit to the number of students that will be able to attend these two conferences. Professional development for educators will take place, that information will be provided in the near future.

Registration Tips:

- The registration portal requires you to register yourself (advisors) as the primary attendee first so you get all event emails and have access to modify your registrations.

- When modifying registration to add more attendees, the system requires you to click "continue" until you reach the "register another" page. This is where you can add additional students or chaperones.
- When you have finished registering all members of your group, be sure to click the "make payment" button, this will make sure that all of your attendees have be confirmed and will give you access to your invoice.

FFA Membership: The new **FFA roster** year started on September 1st. There have been many updates and changes to the system. Please read **ALL** of the following information carefully so that this transition can be as smooth of a process as possible. We have created a new page on our www.nysffa.org website just for help with FFA membership and help with rosters. Please visit this link for information and tutorials on how to do your student roster this year: http://www.nysffa.org/membership/. As our state continues to see growth in our membership, we are starting to see some overlap with our homeschools and BOCES centers having students in two programs. As a reminder, students can only be members in one chapter. This is a student's choice which chapter they will be a member of. In order to be a member of a chapter students should be receiving instruction from the certified agriculture teacher at that program. **A new policy that took affect September 1st is, 7-12th grade members must be added to the national roster, only 6th graders can be added to the NY Only Roster.**

National FFA Updates:

1. Hurricanes Irma and Maria Relief for Puerto Rico

Many of you have reached out about helping our friends in Puerto Rico after hurricanes Irma and Maria. The situation, as widely reported, is devastating. There is significant catastrophic damage, and lines for rationed food, gas, and water often stretch for days. Survival remains the top priority. The storms have especially impacted our FFA members and advisors, many of whom work and live on the outskirts of the heaviest-populated centers.

National FFA recently established limited contact with state staff in Puerto Rico, and we are working with them to see how we can help. 2. Watch FFA in Action

If you haven't had a chance, take a few minutes to check out our <u>FFA Video Center</u>. We have videos on topics ranging from careers in agriculture and FFA history to supervised agricultural experiences. Speaking of SAEs, we recently added a new <u>video profile on FFA member Peyton Moore</u> from Bullard, Texas, and her SAE in agritourism. She works on her family's pumpkin patch. On fall weekends, people can pick their own pumpkins, and Peyton helps to educate them about how pumpkins are grown and about agriculture in general.

3. Convention Student Workshops

More good news about the national convention and expo continues to come across my desk. We just learned that more than 12,400 students attended student workshops this year. There were 90 student workshop opportunities at convention. Attendance by day was Wednesday -1,193; Thursday -6,713; and Friday -4,590. Our education team collected attendance numbers for each workshop and will review attendance numbers, in conjunction with workshop student evaluations, to prepare for 2018.

4. Arkansas Alumni Strong

Staff member Allie Ellis joined Alumni Council members Taylor McNeel and Bill Carlson to facilitate workshops at the Arkansas FFA Alumni State Conference in Bismarck Nov. 3-4. More than 50 FFA Alumni members attended, including several collegiate alumni chapters and U.S. Rep. Bruce Westerman.

5. Mobilizing Legions of Volunteers

The alumni team is proud to announce that growth in the association has hit another record! In 2009, there were 50,307 alumni members; today, there are 344,239 alumni members! On both visits, Secretary Perdue and attending congressmen Jimmy Panetta and Jim Costa spoke on the importance of leadership from FFA members like Breanna and Mark as we prepare to develop young people to pursue agricultural careers and face the challenge of

the aging farmer population.
