# **National FFA Updates:**

### 1. California Wildfires Update

We have just learned this week that the Camp Fire ravaging Northern California—the state's deadliest wildfire to date—has impacted members of our agricultural education family. The fire has destroyed the homes of the agriculture teacher at Durham High School and an agricultural education professor at California State University in Chico. And, several agriculture teachers' families and a retired agriculture teacher have also lost their homes. Please continue to keep those affected by these life-altering events in your thoughts and prayers. Also amazing are the stories of our FFA Family, some of whom are in the midst of tragedies themselves, helping those in need. Here's an example of some of the stories we've been hearing (email edited for space; see attached screenshots):

I am sending this email to express that we have three amazing FFA advisors at Gridley FFA in California who have stepped up during this tragedy. They have spent hours and days helping to get animals out of the affected places and helping wherever needed, even while one of the advisors was evacuated herself. The advisors have reached out to their chapters and have had the students helping. They have set up panels and trailered out animals. They also make sure the animals have clean pens and are fed and watered. FFA advisor Jennifer Kaslin even put on a floral class to have all the proceeds go to the Paradise FFA, and I'm sure that I have left out many other things they have done. I believe Jennifer, Matthew Reed and Nick Dreesmann of the Gridley FFA should be recognized for the HEROS they are.

For the first time in the organization's history, the National FFA welcomed sustainability leaders to the national convention and expo, with nearly every part of the food value chain represented. The group toured the convention and expo Thursday afternoon, watched agricultural issues leadership development event finalists, and learned about AgExplorer, Living to Serve, and agriscience fair. On Friday, FFA members, educators, and state staff joined the group as everyone listened to examples of sustainable systems, partnerships, and practices. The group spent the morning trying to identify and prioritize the key areas where agricultural education and FFA align with consumers and industry. The initiative was driven by John Niemann, the 2019 National FFA Sponsors' Board chair from Cargill and coordinated by Christine White and Todd Greenwood from FFA.
