We have been working on at four new initiatives for the State Fair this year. With the State Fair hosting over 1 million people and having the National FFA President, David Townsend, joining us we want to take full advantage of these opportunities to engage our members but also the public.

- -The first new initiative is called the **AIM** (Action Influences Members) Experience which will take place Saturday, 8/26, and Sunday, 8/27, at the Empire Room on the fairgrounds. The goal behind this experience is to help your chapter get excited and prepared for the upcoming year. We have will have close to 100 participants this year. As you will note on the attached information, Saturday is optional to attend. This way if you are not able to spend the night you can still participate on Sunday. To encourage new ideas chapters who participate on Sunday will have the opportunity to win a \$500 grant to implement what they develop during the conference. Visit our website for more updates.
- -The second new initiative will be to encourage chapters to bring displays to the fair. The National FFA President will pick one or two displays that really stand out and in return those 1 or 2 chapters will have the opportunity to have the National FFA President take your chapter out to dinner or a fun activity. # Delegate Committees Set for the 90th National FFA Convention & Expo

As outlined in Article XIII of the National FFA Constitution, the 2016-17 National FFA Officer Team has commissioned six special committees for delegate consideration at the 90th National FFA Convention & Expo. These committees were formed from the 20 proposals submitted by state associations and National FFA staff to the leadership delegates at State Presidents' Conference. # FFA Visits the Empire State

Last week, COO Joshua Bledsoe and Local Program Success Specialist Karen Hutchison met with the New York state staff and other agricultural education supporters in Syracuse, N.Y., for a state relations visit. Several topics were discussed and ideas shared. New York agricultural education staff, the New York Association of Agricultural Educators (NYAAE), the foundation, alumni and other supporters were excited to share information on the number of new programs and FFA charters issued not only this year but also over the last few years. Even though the state added 20 new programs this year, a waiting list for 60

additional programs remains.

As with many states, providing enough teachers is a challenge. New York, however, has made the commitment to hire someone who will focus on teacher recruitment and retention. The state is also seeing increased financial support for FFA and agricultural programs. NYAAE shared information on their strong connection to Ag in the Classroom, which helps educate more students about agriculture. Many thanks to Shari Lighthall for arranging this informative meeting.

One of the results that has come from this meeting is below:

Derek and Sari,

I wanted to let you both know just how much I appreciated our visit with you and the entire NY Team Ag Ed a few weeks ago. I think we accomplished a great deal and I'm glad we were able to discuss issues that we all are passionate about in a productive manner.

Upon my return, I talked in our management team meetings and in turn, we shared at the board meeting this week, the feedback you provided regarding the language in the charter around the selection of national officers. Our management team agrees that we should include some type of statement ensuring that national officers are elected with regional representation in mind. We all think that makes sense. We aren't going to spell out the number of regions or the number of officers from each region, but we do think it's important to include regional representation language in the revised charter. I appreciate you all sharing that with me and spurring our thoughts further on that topic.

Thank you both for what you do. I know and appreciate the roles you play in New York. We are ready and able to assist you and your entire team in any way we can ... just let us know how we can best be of service to you.

# **Alumni Bylaw Amendments**
