It introduces students to the many opportunities to learn and develop real-world skills outside of the classroom and beyond the school day. This guide will provide students and parents:

- Clarity about what an SAE is and how it works
- A roadmap to get on the correct SAE path
- An understanding of how an SAE provides Real Learning for a Real Future!

<u>The Teacher Guide</u> provides additional clarity and details about expectations for student learning outcomes. It also includes tools and frameworks to guide implementation. It is meant to supplement the SAE for All Student Guide and provide teachers practical guidance, tools and examples to do the following:

- Help students understand what an SAE is, the value it provides and how to get started
- Ensure all students enrolled in agricultural education courses have an SAE
- Connect SAE to school priorities
- Integrate SAE into classroom grading system

Additional work is underway on creation of six implementation guides that address the Foundation SAE along with individual guides for each type of immersion SAEs. These should be released by December of this year.



The new **FFA roster** year started on September 1st. There have been many updates and changes to the system. Please read **ALL** of the following information carefully so that this can be as smooth of a process as possible.

The link below will take you to several roster guides that will show you how to do each step of the roster. You can also find this information in the roster system by clicking on the icon that looks like a wrench. **One of the biggest changes** is that students can now self-register and all the advisor needs to do is go in and approve them and submit them to state for approval.

On each page will be a "wrench" symbol. Clicking on the "wrench" will provide you with two training tools. 

Self-Registration-

In the development of rosters this fall we have created an option for individuals to self-register for membership as well as chapter leadership roles. This was developed to continue to move the workload downstream for state and chapter leaders. Individuals that use the self-registration process are able to fill out their personal information and submit the request for membership to their local leader for approval. They may also request a transfer. The same holds true for chapter leaders that would like to use the self-registration process. In the case of chapter leaders, the request is sent to state leadership to approve. Once approved these individuals will appear on the roster no different than if you entered them on the roster as you have in the past. The advantage to self-registration is that you no longer have to do the work, just let your members or leaders self-register and approve them in the "Approve Pending Memberships" or "Manage Chapter Leadership" sections. (Instructions on self-registration will be sent out by end of day Friday 9/1)



Bad Date-of-Birth-

We have eliminated obvious bad date-of-birthday from the database, such as 1/1/1900. If a profile has lost its DOB it will be required. There are calculations in place to ensure the date is not a random date based on other data points such as graduation year, grade, # of years teaching...

State Staff will be learning this new system along with all of you. We will do our best to help you through this process. We highly recommend that you spend some time learning this system and do not wait until the last minute to add students to your roster. We would like to welcome back Jordan Henry to FFA as our new education specialist – advocacy and literacy based out of Alexandria, Va., in our National FFA Headquarters operations office. Jordan will rejoin the organization on Monday and will report to Riley Pagett, director of advocacy and government relations.

4. Teach Ag Day Is Sept. 21

We are less than a week away from the very important National Teach Ag Day, Thursday, Sept. 21. Our friends at the National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE) have planned a wonderful day of celebrating ag teachers, including a live webcast from 1 - 3 p.m. EDT at Chicago High School for Agricultural Sciences. NAAE's efforts, along with that of the National Council for Agricultural Education, have helped to address the harsh reality that some FFA programs are only one ag teacher away from extinction. At this time, agriculture teacher retention is at its highest level in over a decade at 96 percent. There is an increasing number of agricultural education degree programs and enrollees, even as other education degree areas are experiencing decreases. And, 74 percent of college students graduating from agricultural education/teacher preparation programs are accepting teaching positions in middle schools and high schools around the country, the highest level since the National Teach Ag Campaign, launched by The Council, began in 2011. 5. 90th National FFA Convention & Expo Early Bird Registration Now Live!

On Tuesday, early bird registration opened for this year's convention. Early bird rates will last through Oct. 2, and then standard rates will kick in from Oct. 3 - 28. 6. Number of FFA Alumni Chapters Continue to Rise

We are still finalizing the membership numbers for 2016-17, but we can share some exciting news: 199 alumni chapters chartered or reactivated last year to help local FFA student members across the country! We will have more data, including student and chapter membership figures, soon.

7. Chapter Leadership Conference Updates

Our 212° and 360° conferences are underway with a train-the-trainer event happening this week in Illinois. Roughly 30 212° and 360° conferences will occur this fall alone, delivering leadership development to more than 4,300 FFA members. The first of these conferences began Sept. 1; however, most will occur in November and December. 212° and 360° conferences for the 2017-18 school year continue into the spring.

Final attendance numbers are in for the 2017 Washington Leadership Conference (WLC)—2,239 students and 341 advisors and guests. We have compiled and are reviewing evaluations from the participants, but we thought you'd like to see a few of the comments that reflect on the participants' experiences (see attached).

8. Arkansas State Relations Meeting

Chief Operating Officer Josh Bledsoe, Convention, Awards and Recognition Director Dale Crabtree and Local Program Success Specialist Nina Crutchfield participated in a state relations meeting with Arkansas on Monday. It was great to hear about all the forward momentum the state's leaders have had through the last 18 months. Stakeholders have been engaged in updating instructional frameworks around the national content standards, growing their state convention with a move to the Hot Springs Convention Center next April, making improvements to their Camp Couchdale, transitioning their collegiate members

to alumni, supporting their early career teachers, and looking for ways to grow their state FFA foundation. It truly is a great time to be a part of Arkansas agricultural education and FFA in the state.

- Registration will again be in Hall K of the Convention Center. If a teacher has a CDE team registered, they may register for Convention at the Fairgrounds.
- It is extremely important that all registered attendees have their name badge on at all times. The National FFA Convention is a "closed convention" which means you must be registered and have a name badge to enter any Convention events.

Now is a great time to remind chapters that the signup period for affiliation is open. Interested chapters should fill out the attached document and send it back to State Staff by November 1st. State staff must approve all chapter affiliation requests by November 15th. State staff maintains possession of the Chapter Affiliation Agreement (attached). Do not send this to the National FFA Office.

Please note that opting in to affiliation is a long-term decision that must include the support and signature of a chapter's school principal. Chapters should opt-in to promote all three circles of ag education in an effort to ensure that FFA membership is seamless and fully integrated for all.
