Agriculture

- Food Insecurity transitioning to Nutritional Insecurities
 - Economic shifts due to COVID-19 have caused extreme shifts in food insecurity. More and more people have decreased access to nutritional foods. This change has led to a concentrated focus of providing access to all and shifting the phrasing to include not just food insecurities but nutritional insecurities
